Annual Meeting MARCH 8, 2016 7:00PM

The Annual Meeting for the Town of Linwood will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 8, 2016 in the Linwood Senior Center.

The purpose of the Annual Meeting is to set the operating levy for the year 2017, and to conduct other business pertaining to the operation of the Township. All citizens of the Town of Linwood who are eligible to vote in the Annual Election are qualified to attend and to vote on each action brought before the people's meeting. In case of inclement weather, the Annual Meeting will be postponed until Tuesday, March 15, 2016.

Flood Zone Issue Comes to Linwood

In December, Linwood Township was asked to take over the last item that was still in Anoka County's hands, handling all floodway and flood zone issues. While the township has worked diligently to get up and running on these issues, the Federal government was getting ready to release new flood zone maps for our area. The maps came out the end of December and soon thereafter residents started calling about their homes suddenly showing up in flood zones and mortgage companies asking them to get flood insurance. The Township looked over the new maps and discovered that the Feds did not follow the land contours when they redrew the lines, and yes, that meant the new map is wrong! We are currently helping residents that find themselves facing this issue. We are working with Anoka County and the DNR in a coordinated effort to fix these problems. If you need help solving a flood insurance issue, call Mike Jungbauer at the Town Hall at 651-462-0501 and he will put together a package for you to start the process of changing the mapping on your property.

Outstanding Conservationist Award

The Anoka Conservation District selected Linwood Township to receive the 2015 Outstanding Conservation Award. The award recognizes dedication to establishing and maintaining rain gardens, installing carp barriers, working to control invasive species, and active participation in the Sunrise River Watershed Management Organization.



Clothing Drop Box – Linwood Recycling Center has added a USAgain Clothing Drop box for your convenience in donating clothes, shoes and household textiles that are ready to be re-worn, reused or recycled. Household textiles include tablecloths, towels, beddings, blankets, bedspreads, etc. We can't accept mattresses, furniture, appliances, carpet, household items, toys or trash. Clothes, shoes and textiles must be clean and dry and dropped off in tied plastic bags. A sturdy plastic bag protects the clothes from dirt and simplifies handling. Look for the big green USAgain box in the northwest corner of the Town Hall parking lot. Please don't leave anything outside the bin.

Nominee must be age 70 by June 1, 2016.

Nominee must currently do a volunteer activity that is unpaid and demonstrates commitment to their local community.

A previous county winner not chosen as the state winner is eligible; however a 2016 nomination form must be completed. You may only nominate one individual per nomination form. Couple nominations will be disgualified.

Aging Mastery Program

The Linwood Senior Center is pleased to announce that we will be offering a ten-week health and wellbeing package to residents 55 and over. The program is called **Aging Mastery Program**. It was developed by the National Council on Aging (NCOA). The NCOA awarded 13 grants in Minnesota to pilot this project, and Linwood Senior Center is one of them.

This is a wonderful opportunity for older adults, to participate in, and reap the benefits of, this cutting edge wellness program. We are currently recruiting adults (age 55+) to participate in the educational program.

The goal of this program is to empower older adults to make and maintain small but impactful changes. The classes will explore navigating longer lives, physical activity, sleep, healthy eating and hydration, financial fitness, medication management, advance planning, healthy relationships, falls prevention, and community engagement. For each of these classes, we will provide basic educational materials developed from highly trusted sources, a checklist of action steps and a system for tracking behaviors. Participants will earn points for positive actions and rewards.

SNOW PLOWING INFORMATION

Pushing snow across the road and placing obstructions (such as marking stakes) in road rights-of-way are



dangerous and illegal activities. Doing so poses a threat to motorists as well as the plow truck drivers. Violators will be fined and may be liable for injuries sustained and damage to Township equipment. To enable safer snow

removal and limit damage to mailboxes, residents must maintain 42" of clearance under their mailboxes. Paper boxes should be attached alongside and not below the mailbox.

Residential Paper Shredding

Residential Paper Shredding will be available at the Town Hall on Fridays from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm and on the Linwood Monthly 4th Saturday Recycling Days from 8:00 am to noon. This service is available for Linwood residents and is not intended for business or commercial shredding. Please remove metal objects; small staples are ok.

Did you know shredded paper and plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin gets tangled on the sorting equipment at large recycling facilities, and have to be removed by hand causing production delays? Bring paper for shredding to Linwood Town Hall and recycle plastic bags at local retailers.

Dog License

Linwood residents are required to license their dogs each year and show proof of current rabies vaccination. License cost is \$2.00 and expires on December 31st. Licenses are available at the Town Hall office.
