# **Collecting Organics at Linwood Family Fun Days!**

## What is organics for composting?

Collecting organics for composting is a natural process that recycles organic materials, such as food waste, yard trimmings, and non-recyclable papers. Over time, tiny micro-organisms break down these organic materials into a dark brown, organic soil amendment or mulch that is rich in nutrients.




# Why collect organics for composting at events?

- Reduce food waste from going to a landfill or incinerator. Each year in the U.S., approximately
  40% of household trash is food waste, yard waste, and non-recyclable paper waste, all of which
  can be composted.
- In a landfill, there is very little oxygen exposure and the breakdown process is inefficient, generating emissions of methane gas that are harmful to the atmosphere and people. Composted food and paper waste does not produce methane gas and creates a valuable soil amendment to use on farms, lawns, gardens, and potted plants that increases the nutrient content in existing soil and reduces the need for fertilizers, pesticides, and water.
- Organics do not burn well to make a good fuel source for incineration at resource recovery plants, and more land space is required for landfilling organic materials that could be composted.

#### PUMP YOUR SEPTIC TANK

It is a Minnesota State Law that septic systems are pumped every 3 years. It is the longest anyone should go between septic system pumping's. It helps to avoid costly repairs and keeps our groundwater, lakes and rivers clean.

In September of 2014 we have been tracking residents who have had their system pumped. Since September of this year we will be sending out post cards to notify the residents who have not had their septic systems pumped.

It is not recommended to have systems pumped in the winter. On our website, linwoodtownship.org, you will find a list of reputable licensed septic pumper contractors that other residents have used under septic information.

## **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Linwood Township is looking for a few volunteers for our Road and Bridge Committee. Linwood Road and Bridge Committee is comprised of 6 volunteer members. The primary function is to advise the Town Board on Township roads and bridges, recommend road projects, review bids and specifications, recommend a long term plan for sealing coat, overlays and road construction, sweeping and blading, tree trimming, plowing, and a yearly budget for roads and bridges in our Township. #### **New Ordinances**

The Town Board recently passed two new ordinances: a housing ordinance for rental properties and a firearms ordinance. The complete ordinances are available at the town office and on the township website.

The Firearms Ordinance is meant to protect the safety and welfare of persons within the Township by regulating the discharge of firearms within the Township.

The purpose of the Housing Ordinance for Rental Property is to provide minimum standards to safeguard public health and welfare by regulating the use and occupancy, maintenance and repair of all buildings and structures within the Township used as rental housing. The scope of the new ordinance applies to all buildings or portions leased for human living and sleeping purposes, for one to four individually rented units or bedrooms that are non-owner occupied and five to nine individually rented units or bedrooms even if owner occupied. # Quick Note—Snow Policy

#### **SNOW REMOVAL POLICY**

WITH THE ADVENT OF ANOTHER SNOW SEASON COMES THE CONCERN ABOUT ACCESS TO WORK, SCHOOL, AND BUSINESS. THE SAFETY AND CONVENIENCE OF THE TRAVELING PUBLIC IS A PRIMARY CONCERN OF LINWOOD TOWNSHIP. THE TOWNSHIP'S GOAL IS TO HAVE ALL ROADS PASSABLE WITHIN A REASONABLE AMOUNT OF TIME AFTER A SNOWFALL HAS STOPPED. THE TOWNSHIP DOES NOT ASSURE COMPLETELY BARE ROADS, AND NOT ALL SECTIONS OF THE ROADWAY WILL BE SANDED. USERS OF THE ROAD SYSTEM ARE REMINDED TO EXERCISE CAUTION AND DRIVE WITH CARE. DRIVING AT THE LEGAL SPEED LIMIT MAY NOT BE POSSIBLE AT ALL TIMES.

#### **Snow Removal Procedures**

#### 1. Dispatching of Snowplows

The Township will usually not dispatch the snowplows until snow accumulates to 4" or more and the snow has stopped, with the exception of extended periods of snowfall. The snowplows will not be sent out in situations where limited visibility poses a hazard.

#### 2. Operations

Generally, the clearing of roads will consist of three phases: making the road passable, widening and sanding, and clean up. Conditions may allow more than one phase to be accomplished at one time.

#### 3. Personal Properties

- a. Mailboxes and fences damaged during snow removal will be evaluated case by case. Only metal mailboxes, properly located and installed on approved supports, which were damaged by actual contact with township equipment will be repaired at township expense. The township is not responsible for garbage cans that are knocked over/damaged either by direct contact with township equipment, or pushed by the snow plowed from the road.
- b. Township residents are reminded that it is unlawful to plow snow from driveways onto or across public roads. Minnesota Statute 160.2715, subdivision 1, advised that pushing snow from driveways and sidewalks onto public roads may be punishable as a misdemeanor. Snow dumped on roadways creates a real hazard to passing motorists, which can cause serious accidents. Even heavy snowplows have been damaged when hitting compacted and frozen snow deposited on the roadways. Because the practice is illegal to begin with, the person depositing the snow, as the prime cause of any accident, may also find him/herself faced with civil liability lawsuits.
- c. Residents are further reminded of Linwood's parking ordinances. No vehicle, or any portion of a vehicle, shall be allowed to remain parked upon the roadway in such a manner or place that obstructs or impedes emergency vehicles or general traffic. No vehicle, or any portion of a vehicle, shall be allowed to remain parked upon the shoulder or non-driving portion of right-of-way continuously, without being moved, for more than 72 hours. These provisions include those vehicles believed to constitute a potential traffic hazard, as determined by the local authority. Additionally, during the period of November 1 through May 1 of any calendar year, no vehicle, or any portion of a vehicle, shall be allowed to remain parked within the road right-of-way of any town road or street in such a manner or place that obstructs or impedes township snow removal vehicles during snow removal conditions. Vehicles may be towed.
- d. The Maintenance Department will not attempt to remove stuck vehicles from ditches, snow banks or any other impediment.
