





Anoka County Organics Drop-off Program

Recycle food scraps, paper products, coffee grounds and more at the Linwood Township Recycling Center for FREE. When you participate in the organics recycling program, your food scraps and non-recyclable paper products will be recycled into compost. Compost is a valuable resource that improves soil, reduces erosion and decreases the

need for fertilizers.







Bring your compostables to the Linwood Township Recycling Center drop-off site and place organics in the container designated for organics recycling.

Grab more BPI certified bags from the dispensers on your way out.

Selling Your Home or Remodeling?

You Need a Septic Compliance Inspection for:

- Prior to the sale or transfer of a home
- Adding a bedroom or additions over 240 sq ft
- Splitting or subdividing a property
- Permit or variance for improvement of shoreline property

BUT WHY. . . you ask?

Compliance inspections look for three main items:

- 1. Is the septic tank water tight?
- 2. Is the system leeching to the surface?
- 3. Is there at least 2' or 3' (depending on when the system was installed) of dry soils between the bottom of the soil treatment area (drain field) and the mottled soil (water table)?





Exhibits 2 & 3, something the kids will like! Pictures geared for younger kids, but appropriate for all ages.


Cemetery Tour:
