Minnesota's 1,781 townships will hold their annual meeting on Tuesday, March 8. Known as Township Day, these annual meetings are held every year on the second Tuesday in March. Residents of the township will meet to voice their opinions about local issues with other township residents and also vote directly on their annual tax levy; direct democracy in action. The proposed levy was not available at the time of this publication, but will

be available on the township website, along with the agenda and last year's minutes.

Mark your calendar to attend at 7:00 p.m. at the Linwood Town Hall, Tuesday, March 8th.

Burning Permits

Storms may create tree and debris damage. If you are going to burn brush, a burning permit is required when the ground is not completely covered by a minimum of 3 inches of snow. To obtain a burning permit, visit the township office during office hours or contact the local fire wardens.

Be sure to check the DNR fire danger and burning restrictions webpage before considering any debris burning. Escaped debris burns are the number one cause of wildfires. People who burn debris will be held financially responsible if their fire escapes and burns other property.

The burning of building materials, including treated wood, insulation, or shingles, is PROHIBITED.

When possible, composting and chipping, or transporting to a brush collection site are preferred to burning. You may bring your leaves, grass clippings and small brush to the Linwood Recycling Center to compost your yard waste.

West Branch Sunrise River Removed from State Impaired Waters List

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency recently released their every-two-year update of the State's impaired waters list. Among the success stories was the West Branch of the Sunrise River in Anoka County and flowing into Chisago County. It was removed from the impaired waters list.

The impaired waters list is streams and lakes that fail to meet state water quality standards. Most of those standards are for recreation, such as excessive nutrients and algae, or for aquatic life. When a waterbody is impaired, the state and others prioritize efforts to improve water quality.

The portion of the river from Martin Lake to Pool 1 was listed as impaired for high pH which can affect aquatic fish, bugs, and other life. High pH was due to high nutrients and algae in Martin Lake just upstream.

Water quality improvement projects at Martin and Typo Lakes has led to pH returning to acceptable levels. Projects over the last 10 years have included rain gardens, stormwater ponds, and carp management. Both Martin and Typo Lakes have improving water quality trends, and Martin Lake has on average met state water quality standards for nutrients the last five years. It is hopeful that Martin Lake will be removed from the Minnesota impaired waters list in two years.

Partners in the water quality improvement efforts have included the Sunrise River Watershed Management Organization, Linwood Township, Anoka Conservation District, and Martin Lakers Association.

This is a reminder to all dog owners in Linwood Township that dog licenses are required for all dogs over 6 months of age. Proof of rabies vaccination is required.

Dog licenses are valid from January 1 through December 31 and must be obtained every year.

Licenses are available at the Town Hall during office hours or may be requested by mail. Failure to license may result in a fine or administrative citation.

Please note that only 2 dogs are allowed per household in Linwood. A kennel license is required for households wanting 3 or more dogs.

Call 911 if you or others are in immediate physical danger and need help from the police, fire department, or an ambulance.





Why: Batteries and electronics can damage equipment and harm workers sorting the recycling. Batteries are particularly dangerous, especially lithium-ion batteries found in cell phones, since they can start fires when punctured.

IMPORTANCE OF HOUSE NUMBERS DURING AN EMERGENCY



The fire code states address identification characters shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numbers or alphabetical letters. Numbers shall not be spelled out. Each character shall be not less than 4 inches high with a minimum stroke width of 1/2 inch. The following guidelines will help you know how to display your house number.

On Your House

Visible from both directions of travel

- Trees, bushes, or other debris should not block visibility from the road.
 - \gg Numbers should be placed above eye level near the front door within a radius of the porch light.

On Your Mailbox

Mark both sides of your mailbox, instead of the door

- The numbers on the mailbox need to be highly visible.
- Another option is to mount a sign above or below the mailbox making sure the sign color contrasts from the mailbox color.
- If your mailbox is not in front of your house or near your driveway, emergency responders cannot locate you unless you have your house number on your house or on a post or sign in your yard.

Address Signs

 \gg Bigger **IS** better. The number should be at least four inches tall if displayed on a house or sign.

Address signs should be placed about two feet from the driveway in the direction of the house.



Pick a color that will contrast with the background. If your house is a dark color, then the address sign should be light so that the number stands out and can be viewed from the street. For example, a black number is perfect on a white house. A white number will also show clearly on a brick house. A

lighted number is even better for easy visibility at night.

🖓 Avoid bronze numbers.

Following these guidelines will save valuable time in the event of an emergency. Can you flush baby wipes, or any kind of wipes, when you have a septic system?



There are so many kinds of wipes these days - baby wipes, medicated wipes, wet wipes, makeup wipes, lotion wipes, cleansing wipes, deodorant wipes and more – and some of their manufacturers insist they're flushable. Yes, they'll flush, but should you? The simple answer is no.

Obviously, you don't want any of these issues. Wipes of all kinds are better put in the garbage can.

What can happen if wipes are flushed into your septic system?

- ! The chemicals in them offset the bacterial balance in the tank.
- ! Wipes can plug your septic tank and cause it to back up in your house.
- Grease, fat and, grime collect with the wipes and create huge clogs called fatbergs.
- An accumulation of wipes prevents the tank from separating solids from the water.
- If you have an aeration system, wipes build up on the air distribution system and cause failures.
